When Saul and all Israel heard those words of the Philistine, they were dismayed, and greatly afraid. ¶Now David was the son of that Ephrathite of Bethlehemjudah, whose name was Jesse; and he had eight sons: And David was the youngest: and the three eldest followed Saul. But David went and returned from Saul to feed his father's sheep at Bethlehem. And the Philistine drew near morning and evening, and presented himself forty days. And

Jesse said unto David his son, Take now for thy brethren an ephah of this parched corn, and these ten loaves, and run to the camp to thy brethren;

¶And David rose up early in the morning, and left the sheep with a keeper, and took, and went, as Jesse had commanded him;

And David left his carriage in the hand of the keeper of the carriage, and ran into the army, and came and saluted his brethren.
